11:05 – Treasurers' Report. Corinne speaks on their behalf.

- Income still coming in with monthly donations.
- 2K of spending
- Made \$900 last month.
- We're at a deficit, without our main auction we'll be 30K short.
- Letter from Jacqui asking for family donations, please help out.
- Why do we still have expenses? We're receiving invoices for things like yearbook, graduation, and equity workshops. We need money to pay these.
- Jacqui hasn't had any information from the DOE what her budget is going to be.
- Vote on a 2020-21 budget at the next PTA meeting.
- New direct appeal sent out through Jacqui's newsletter to make donations. 25k 30K needs to be made up with direct donations. Whatever you can do.

11:08 - Jacqui

- Misses everyone!
- A lot of feedback from families and they take all into account. School is writing curriculum to keep up with remote learning. Teachers completed essays to administration on what it would look like to move from remote (home) to brick (at the school) learning.
- Donna Santman, 8th grade ELA teacher, has spent much of her past two months going to school to get computers from Ed and crew who are working at the school. Donna has driven around LI and Queens to kids who have not gotten computers from the DOE.
- Donna has also been spearheading a Book Drive leaving books on the curbs for families. A source sent in Amazon GC used to buy books to a handful of children.
- P/T Conferences are happening this week. Please make sure you schedule yours.
- Many teachers host live office hours. Ask your child to drop in.
- Graduation Stella, Nick, and Alexandra will go into this later.
- A lot going into virtual graduation.
- Field trips the Whitney Museum virtual is happening this week.



- Speakers signed up to keep remote learning engaged. In ELA the Photo essay observations are poignant. Proud of ELA team for creating this project.
- Budget cuts could be 10-20%. Maintain staff and have money left over technology. Technology will be important remotely. Saving money for that.
- High School process for 7th graders the school knows nothing yet. Parents will know as soon as the staff knows. Letters and blast sent to parents. Start the process now of looking into schools. Parents are responsible.
- Last two weeks of school will be set for planning. Teachers need time to get ready for September. Students will complete the required 120 days of schools – some days would have been about testing. What assessments can be used? Have to get ready for every scenario.
- Summer school will be for children who are academically challenged it's not enrichment.
- The older brother of one of our 7th graders, Sasha Levine (at Stuy) offering help to some of our kids. Free tutoring and help from many groups of college kids. They're coming up with wonderful ideas.
- Katie next school year we're adding STEM intensive. Current 6th grade students can choose STEM or band, chorus, drama, visual art. 7th graders will stay in their regular intensives. STEM is only for incoming 6th graders and next year's 7th graders. School is receiving a \$100K grant from Tides/Google foundation for technology and for STEM.
- Jill exciting news. Pyschotherapy group on NYU campus, The Collaborative a small grant to have mental health partnership with schools and Morton was asked to participate. Webinar in early June to support families, specifically parenting during the time of Coronavirus. 5 weeks of school remaining webinar will address how to adapt to isolation and remote learning and minimize conflict. Considering tech use from the child and adult point of view to what degree would the pandemic change the rules? We'll have smaller workshops when we're back in school.
